The story of this teaches us to be strong like the Mundarlbi reef. We can use this in our everyday life because it teaches us to never let anything bring us down. It teaches us Pride, Strength and Resilience that generates from our foundations and connections like Identity, Family, Culture and Country. Mundarlbi is a traditional Lardil song that was Dreamt by one of our senior songmen Cecil 'Ngawalin' Goodman, Ngawalin meaning "hard rock". This painting is a dedication to him as he has now passed on. - Renee Wilson.

She has extended her experience and confidence through employment at the House as a kitchen assistant, and in education and transition administration.




Kelly Dalton

Kelly has also expressed interest in working at rural and remote airports following high school.




Kairon Hudson

With Kairon progressing well towards his QCE, we know that his determination to do his best will mean he will be just fine in whatever he chooses to do.



Thanks to her hard work and effort, Shontay has built a strong foundation for her future, and is sure to succeed in whatever she puts her mind to.




Desharnthie Nona


Connor Rogers
